


What we have learned...

• Social Studies: What can we learn from the Native Americans and Colonists? We have been studying Native Americans and making totem poles. We have also learned about the 13 colonies, which we got to complete a research project over them.

• **Reading/Language**: Our Essential Question for the first few weeks was...*What can immigration and times long ago teach us*? Students will work cooperatively in groups read stories and make, confirm, and revise predictions.

Science: We have been learning about animals and how they survive. We got to create an ecosystem, which we put our new pet fish named Spike into.

Word Problems



We have been focusing on addition and subtraction word problems. These problems involve 3 digit numbers and require regrouping.
