Purpose of Meeting



- The Elementary and Secondary School Act, Title I Part A, requires that each Title I school hold an annual meeting for the parents and families whose children receive Title I services.
- Informing you of the school's participation in Title I, Part A
- Explaining the requirements of Title I, Part A
- Explaining your rights and opportunities as parents and families to be involved in your child's learning and achievement



What is Title I?



- Title 1 is the nation's largest federal program for schools.
- Title I provides federal funding to schools to help students who are low achieving or at most risk of falling behind.
- It provides funding aimed at increasing student achievement and building parent involvement in schools.
- Schools are identified as Title 1 based on the economic level of the families in the school's attendance area.
- Title I is allocated to schools based on the percentage of student receiving free/reduced lunch.
- Title I was first created under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA), and was later amended in 2001 (NCLB) and in 2015 (ESSA),

Allen Village School operates a Title I Schoolwide Program.

Schoolwide means:

- The school uses Title I funds to upgrade the entire educational program of the school.
- Title I funds are used to serve all children in order to raise academic achievement.
- Title I funds will be used to provide additional assistance to all students who experience difficulties in meeting the State's performance targets.



To be a “Schoolwide” School:

- The school must have a free/reduced lunch count of at least 40%. Allen Village has over 85% at each of its schools.
- The school must collect and analyze data that effects student achievement.
- The school must develop a comprehensive Title I plan and annually review the effectiveness of the plan.



Goals of Title I



- Increase academic achievement.
- Provide direct instructional support to students.
- Provide professional development for teachers.
- Promote parent involvement.

Besides **Title I**, Allen Village School also benefits from these Federal Programs.



Title II: Provides funding for professional development for educators

Title III: Provides funding to ensure and support the achievement of English learners (Els).

Title IV: Provides funding to help provide a well-rounded education including Health/Wellness, STEM, Arts, Civics, and Technology.

Academic Achievement Curriculum and Instructional Strategies:

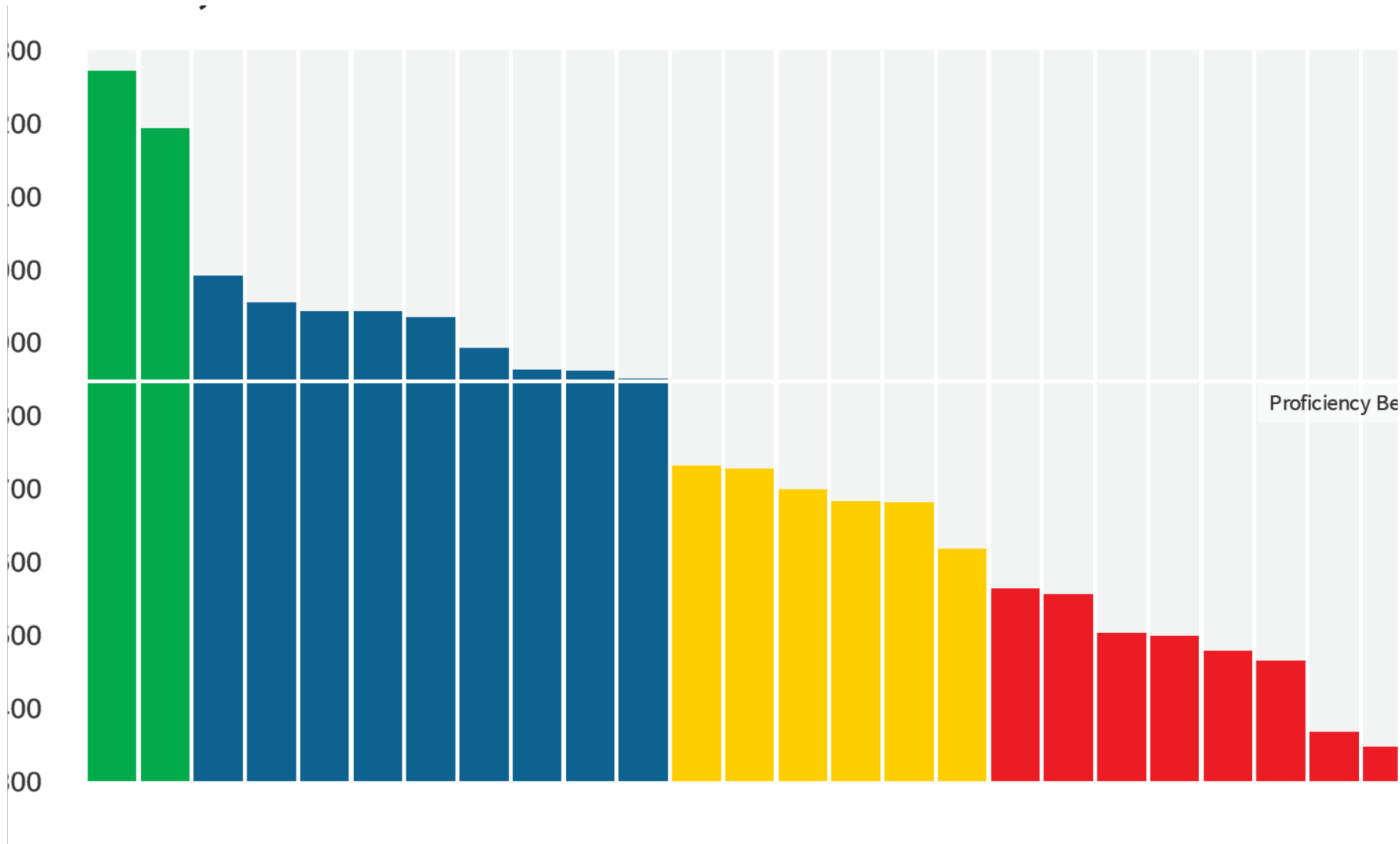
- Allen Village School's curriculum is based on the Missouri Learning Standards from the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.
- These standards define the knowledge and skills students need in each grade level and course for success in college, other post-secondary training and careers. These expectations are aligned to the Show-Me Standards, which define what all Missouri high school graduates should know and be able to do.
- Teachers are given professional development on effective research based instructional strategies.

Data Analysis



Usually every year in Missouri, students in grades 3-8 and students in specific High School courses take the MAP or EOC state achievement tests in English Language Arts and Math. Some grades/courses also take Science and Social Studies tests.

Due to COVID19, the MAP and EOC tests were cancelled in the Spring of 2020, but Allen Village was able to complete 3 of the 4 quarter assessments using STAR in Math and Reading. This school year, Allen Village will be using the STAR and a new assessment called MOLEAP to help analyze if students have any gaps due to distance learning.

Parent Involvement Policies

- Allen Village School believes that Parent Involvement is an important component of a successful education
- The parent-teacher conferences provide an opportunity for parents and teachers to communicate about student progress. The quarterly progress is given out at this time. It is imperative that parents attend all conferences.
- The excellent educators of Allen Village School believe that education is a collaborative venture between parents/guardians and school personnel. Parents/guardians are welcome to visit 5 or 10 minutes or up to 45 minutes in a classroom. All visitors are under jurisdiction of the principal in order to fulfill the responsibilities of maintaining a safe and orderly learning environment.
- Families are required to complete at least 10 volunteer hours per school year. (5 hours by December 15 and a total of 10 hours by May 1). Multiple opportunities are available throughout the school year. Parents are encouraged to check the web site or inquire with their individual classroom teachers for specific volunteer areas and opportunities. Families not completing their volunteer hours will be demitted from Allen Village School.
- Allen Village provides many opportunities for parents to attend special events and meetings at the school.

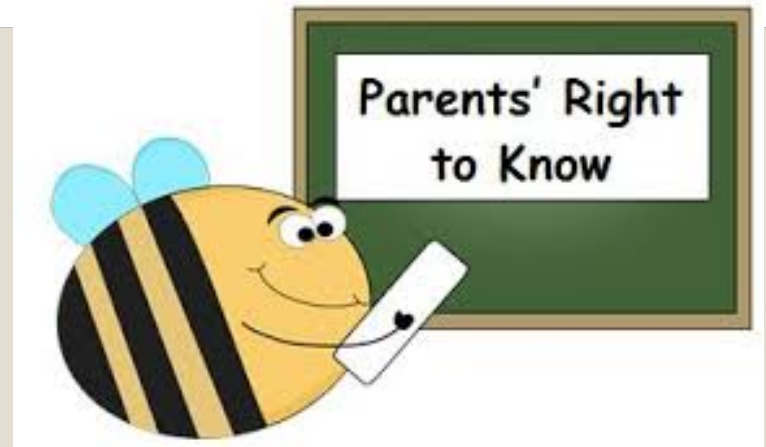
